9   The Council of SELL Games: The representatives of the NUSFs of Finland, Estonia, Latvia and  
10   Lithuania (max. 2 per country). The Council is responsible of updating the regulations of the SELL  
11   Games. The Council has its meeting during the SELL Games and more often if needed.

16                                   **REGULATIONS FOR ORGANISING THE SELL GAMES**

17  
18   **1. GENERAL TERMS**

19  
20       1.1. SELL Games (hereinafter referred to as Games) are organized alternately in Estonia,  
21       Lithuania, Finland and Latvia.

22  
23       1.2. The Games shall traditionally take place on the second part of May from Friday to  
24       Sunday.

25  
26       1.3. National University Sports Federation of the organizing country shall present the place,  
27       organiser and general information of the next in the previous Games, not later than one  
28       year in advance. Advertising material of the next Games (brochures, etc.) shall be handed  
29       out to the Council of the SELL Games and the participants of the Games during the  
30       previous Games.

31  
32       1.4. The National University Sports Federation has the main responsibilities of organizing the  
33       Games being the coordinating body. NUSF must call for the patronages of FISU and  
34       EUSA.

35  
36       1.5. The regulations of the International Sports Federation are followed in each sport. If there  
37       are any exceptions to these regulations, the organizer must inform the participants off  
38       those exceptions on the website of the Games and in the SELL Games manual.

41   **2. PARTICIPANTS OF THE SELL GAMES**

42  
43       2.1. In case of team sports the university teams (players of the team from the same university  
44       only) shall participate in the Games.

45  
46       2.2. In team sports there must be minimum one match per day for all teams during the  
47       competition and the team must play all their matches.

48  
49       2.3. All participants shall represent their own university.  
50

51 2.4. There is no age limit for the participants.  
52

53 2.5. The SELL Games shall be open for participation for the university students from all over  
54 the world.

### 56 **3. THE PROGRAM OF THE SELL GAMES** 57

58 3.1. The program of the Games shall be approved by the organizer of the Games and it will  
59 contain a selection made from the following sports: athletics, swimming, judo,  
60 wrestling, basketball, volleyball, (mini)football, floorball, badminton, orienteering.  
61 Organizers may add or replace up to three sports in the program.  
62

63 3.2. Minimum number of the sports is 7.  
64

65 3.3. The average duration of the Games is 3 days.  
66

67 3.4. The number of participants per sport, minimum and maximum, may be limited by the  
68 organizers and this must be written in the event manual and on the homepage.  
69

70 3.5. Organizers are free to arrange a conference/exhibition about students sports within the  
71 framework of the Games.  
72

73 3.6. Opening ceremony shall take place on the first day of the Games and organizing rights  
74 are transferred to the next organizer during the closing ceremony.  
75

76 3.7. The organizer of the Games shall provide with the results of the Games electronically on  
77 the Internet during one month after the Games at the latest. The organizer shall also  
78 provide the hard copies of the results at least for every NUSF.  
79

80 3.8. The organizer of the Games shall provide a selection of photos of the Games to the  
81 archive of the Games-and shall be expected to forward the photos and video materials to  
82 the National University Sports Federations participating in the SELL Games.  
83

### 84 **4. FINANCING OF THE GAMES** 85

86 4.1. Participation fee is 25EUR/day/person for SELL member (includes entrance to all  
87 competitions, cultural activities, and catering three times a day).

88 Participation fee is 30EUR/day/person for non-SELL member (includes entrance to all  
89 competitions, cultural activities, and catering three times a day).

90 Organizer can charge separately 5EUR/person/night for floor loddging  
91

92 4.2. Additional fee may be required for the hostel/hotel accommodation.  
93

94 4.3. The organiser of the Games shall ensure the safety and good condition of the  
95 competition venues  
96

97 4.4. All participants are required to have appropriate medical (and travel) insurance to cover  
98 for medical expenses. The organisers shall ensure first aid at the competition venues for  
99 all accredited persons.  
100

101 4.5. Organizing country shall invite the representatives of the SELL Countries (National  
102 University Sports Federations) to participate in the Games and shall ensure hotel  
103 accommodation for two (2) persons per country from the budget of the Games or from  
104 the budget of the NUSF.

105  
106 4.6. The organizer of the Games or NUSF shall arrange the meeting of the representatives of  
107 the SELL Countries during the Games.

## 108 **5. PROTOCOLS**

111 5.1. Opening Ceremony shall include at least these elements:

- 112 - Welcome speech of the organising country
- 113 - March pass of the participating universities
- 114 - Speech of the FISU representative
- 115 - Speech of the EUSA representative
- 116 - Cultural program
- 117 - Arrival of the SELL flag
- 118 - Playing of the University Sports anthem (Gaudeamus)

120 5.2. Closing ceremony shall include at least these elements:

- 121 - Closing speech of the organising country
- 122 - Handing over the SELL flag to the next organiser
- 123 - Presentation speech of the next SELL Games
